Title: LEGO-Based Therapy – Train the Trainer

Date: Tuesday 17th October 2023 (9:30am - 3.00pm).

Presenters: Dr Jacob Fox and Dr Becky Lawrence,

Educational Psychologists.

Venue: Ferndale Primary School.

Suitable for: This course is suitable for teaching assistants, higher level teaching assistants and SENCOs working with children across nursery, primary, secondary and specialist settings.

Content: Lego-based therapy is a prescriptive form of play therapy that aims to provide a safe, supportive and structured environment in which to foster the development of children's social skills.



This evening has been designated as an accessible 'quiet night'. This evening is for those with additional needs, who will benefit from a quieter experience, with reduced crowds. Lego therapy groups can be an effective school-based intervention for children and young people with ASC or communication and interaction difficulties and those who experience difficulties with following instructions, listening, turntaking, sharing, collaborative problem-solving and the learning of concepts.

This one day 'train the trainer' course will cover the psychological theory and research behind Lego-based therapy, its practical implementation and how the intervention can be monitored and assessed.

Title: A Collaborative Workshop Exploring Literacy Difficulties

Date: Tuesday 31st October 2023 (1pm-4pm).

Presenters: Dr Susan Pollock, Educational Psychologist and Rachel Williams, Advisory Teacher.

Venue: Badbury Park Primary School.

Suitable for: SENCOs, teachers and leaders of literacy for primary key stage 2 and secondary key stage 3.

Content: This training explores the psychology of and identification of literacy needs with a focus on evidence-based interventions and practical approaches to support children and young people. It will be an interactive training course which will explore psychological theories related to learning and barriers often associated with literacy difficulties. There will be opportunities to look at case studies where children and young people have become 'stuck' or made little progression in literacy.
