

This training explores the psychology of and identification of literacy needs with a focus on evidence-

based interventions and practical approaches to support children and young people.

It will be an interactive training course which will explore psychological theories related to learning and barriers often associated with literacy difficulties. There will be opportunities to look at case studies where children and young people have become 'stuck' or made little progression in literacy.

This course is suitable for SENCOs, teachers and leaders of literacy for primary key stage 2 and secondary key stage 3.



# Peer awards at the SEND Conference 2023

As part of the SEND Conference in June 2023, we are planning 8 peer awards to recognise the work that practitioners and professionals in Swindon undertake for children, young people and their families in Swindon.

Two of these awards are dedicated for families to be able to express their thanks to practitioners and professionals who have gone over and above their job role to support them.



### **Delivering Better Value**

Swindon Borough Council are committed to working with key partners from across the local area to improve services for children and young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND).

We have been participating in the DfE's Delivering Better Value (DBV) programme, which provides us with an opportunity to submit an application to the DfE for a one-off grant to support reducing the high needs deficit position, whilst continuing to improve outcomes for our children and young people. The grant application and detail will be submitted for consideration in June 2023.

We want to put children and young people at the heart of this plan, and your views as either a parent carer or a professional working within the SEND arena are fundamental in identifying and shaping opportunities for us to do better. To this end, we have two surveys that we are asking as many school based colleagues and parent carers as possible to complete.

This will help us to understand how the Local Authority can support the local area to improve your ability to support children with SEND, the practical changes needed and some of the barriers that we face to deliver change. The survey opens on Monday 17th April and closes on Friday 28th April.
